NO ENTRY FEE

1. Entries accepted Friday, August 7, Noon to 8:00 p.m. and Saturday, August 8, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. **NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER 4 P.M. Saturday.** (Upstairs in Main Pavilion)
An Exhibitor may make only ONE entry in each LOT.
2. ATTENTION EXHIBITORS: SAVE TIME ON ENTRY DAY. We urge you to bring a completed entry form to the fairgrounds with your entries. It is requested that exhibitors with numerous entries MUST BE IN THE DEPARTMENT at least one hour before entries close and we suggest that for each entry you also bring a gummed name and address label to be placed on your exhibitor entry tags. This will avoid the tedious task of filling in your name in pen or pencil on each entry tag.
3. **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE CLEAN.** NO PET HAIR
4. This department will be closed for judging from the Sunday after entries are due until the Monday before fair in order that all judging can be accomplished by opening day.
5. Articles must positively be the handy work of the exhibitor. Any person exhibiting articles not bona fide shall forfeit the premium.
6. All entries are entered and shown at the risk of the owners. While all reasonable care will be exercised in the handling and protection of the exhibits, the officials will in no case be responsible for any losses.
7. All fancywork completed during the latter part of last year and during this year will be shown preference. Any article more than 5 years old will be barred from showing except with permission of the management.
8. Articles entered for premiums must be completed projects. No article will be eligible for premium if it has received a prize in previous years at the Clackamas County Fair. Articles will be barred if they have price tags.
9. Juniors are welcome to compete in any category, but may not compete in similar lots in both Junior and Adult classes.
10. Professional seamstresses may compete in classes listed for professionals but may not compete in similar lots in both professional and non-professional categories (see Class 20).
11. Sets must be pinned together or attached by other means to avoid separation.

RELEASE TIME: Entries must be removed from the pavilion between the hours of 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday, the day following the Fair. Anyone removing display earlier than release time may have premiums withheld. Checks for premiums will be given out by the superintendent as exhibits are released, when possible. **NO CHECKS OR RIBBONS will be mailed.**
